As We Gather

As Christmas approaches, you may be concerned about preparations for your various holiday celebrations. There are presents to buy, decorations to put up, cards to send, and food to prepare. In the reading from Romans 13, Paul encourages us to “put on the armor of light.” We often do not think about how we are preparing ourselves for Christmas. We are often too focused on preparing the external rather than the internal. As Advent begins, remember to prepare more than presents, decorations, and cards. Prepare your heart and mind, body and soul to be ready when Christ comes again. This includes putting on the armor of light.

³⁶“But concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only. ³⁷As were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. ³⁸For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, ³⁹and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. ⁴⁰Then two men will be in the field; one will

be taken and one left. ⁴¹Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken and one left. ⁴²Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. ⁴³But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. ⁴⁴Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.
